

Board Announcement

June 9, 2022

Section 2(a) of the Horizon Charter School Bylaws states that there shall be five members on the Governing Board.

Section 3(c) states that one member shall be a business or community representative, which was never filled when Jim Trimble joined the Board as the Western Placer Unified School District representative.

Section 6(c) states that a vacancy may be filled by the Governing Board via elected, appointed, or designated.

Section 2. Number and Qualifications of Directors Comprising the Governing Board.

- a. The number of Governing Board members shall be five (5) unless changed by amendment to these Bylaws. The number and qualifications of Governing Board members shall comply with the charter issued to Horizon Charter School by the District.

Section 3. Election and Additional Qualifications of Governing Board Members.

- c. A majority of Governing Board members shall elect one (1) Governing Board member who is a business or community representative from Placer County. However, if a business or community representative is not found to fill the position after a three (3) month vacancy, a parent of a Horizon Charter School student may be appointed by a majority of remaining Governing Board members to serve the remainder of the term.

Section 6. Vacancies.

- c. Vacancies may be filled by approval of the Governing Board or, if the number of Directors then in office is less than a quorum, by (a) the affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors then in office at a regular or special meeting of the Board, or (b) a sole remaining Director. Each Director so elected, appointed, or designated shall hold office until the expiration of the term of the replaced Director and continue to hold office until a qualified successor has been elected, appointed, or designated. A notice containing the names of the Governing Board candidates shall be publicly posted at a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the appointment or designation of a Director.

The Governing Board is considering appointing Jim Trimble as the Governing Board Community Representative at the June 16, 2022, Governing Board Meeting; this is a two-year term.

Western Placer Unified School District at this point in time, does not intend to put another representative on the Board until they determine a need to do so.
